Supplemental Educational Services, funded through Title I of the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001, are available to eligible children attending Title I recipient schools in School Improvement Year 2 or beyond. These services are available to children of low-income families and are geared toward improving academic achievement in English/Language Arts and/or Mathematics.

As additional academic areas are added to the School Improvement status calculation, they will be included in the academic focus of Supplemental Educational Services in Arkansas. In 2006-2007, Science was added to Benchmark testing. In 2007-2008, Social Studies will be added to Benchmark testing.

The number of approved applicants to provide SES in Arkansas has grown to more than 40 for the 2007-2008 academic year.

Arkansas, like other states, has had low participation in SES due primarily to transportation issues; availability of services in rural areas of the state; and time conflicts with extracurricular activities such as sports, cheerleading, etc.
